




Randy Sloan

Randy, a proud member of the Klahoose First Nation and of mixed Indigenous heritage, has built an exceptional career centered on leadership, advocacy, and cultural empowerment. Over two decades, he has worked tirelessly to improve the lives of Indigenous families and youth, both in the Canadian Armed Forces and in civilian roles. During his 13 years of military service, Randy distinguished himself as a mentor, counsellor, and leader, contributing to firefighting and flood operations in British Columbia and serving as the BCR Indigenous Liaison Officer (LO).

In his civilian career, Randy has dedicated 24 years to advocating for urban Indigenous families and youth. As Family Development Manager at the Fraser Region Aboriginal Friendship Centre Association (FRAFCA), he oversees programs that integrate Indigenous modalities, cultural safety, and trauma-informed practices. By collaborating with Elders, Knowledge Keepers, and key organizations like MCFD and Fraser Health, Randy ensures culturally relevant and holistic support for at-risk children and families.
